



TRUST REPORT

With Covid-19 admissions significantly reducing to virtually zero work is now underway across the Trust to restore and recover services that have been affected.

The pandemic has had a great effect and taken its strain on members of staff across the Trust. Huge effort is being made to support their wellbeing with many initiatives and services in place to help.



On a positive note, from late December through to April vaccination hubs at both Eastbourne DGH and Conquest Hospital delivered almost 50,000 doses of vaccine to local health and care staff across East Sussex. This has been a remarkable effort and is part of a programme of vaccinating over one million people in Sussex. Our grateful thanks go to everyone involved in the vaccination programme. If you know of someone who hasn't had their vaccination yet please do encourage them to have one.

Joe Chadwick-Bell, pictured right, has recently been appointed as Chief Executive of East Sussex Healthcare NHS Trust on a substantive basis having been Chief Executive on an interim basis since September last year, following the retirement of Adrian Bull.



Joe has over 30 years of experience in the health sector. She has worked in both ambulance and acute provider trusts, along with a period of time at the Strategic Health Authority. Joe began her NHS career working in the Pharmacy Department at Eastbourne DGH back in 1989.

Joe said: "It is an honour to be appointed substantively to the role of Chief Executive at the Trust. I have been immensely proud and privileged to have been the interim Chief Executive over the past eight months, a period that has been the most challenging the NHS has ever had to face. Everyone has played their part.

"I want to build on the dedication, teamwork and commitment everyone in ESHT has shown over the past year. Everyone has come together to adapt and change, working together as a part of one fantastic team with respect and compassion for our patients and one another. This is a solid foundation on which to strengthen our reputation as a place in which people want to work and receive care."



A new stereotactic biopsy service, which can help to diagnose cancerous cells in breast tissue using a mammography machine, has started in the Eastbourne DGH Radiology department. Patients who require this procedure previously had to travel to the Park Centre for Breast care in

Brighton. This new service at Eastbourne is available for patients across East Sussex.

A new heart rhythm pathway, set up a year ago, to monitor stroke patients at Eastbourne DGH has been a success at identifying earlier a group of patients at potential risk of another stroke due to their abnormal heart rhythm (arrhythmia).

The cause of some patient's stroke is often unexplained. In these cases, a heart monitor, the size of two matchsticks, is implanted just under the skin by a specialist nurse before they leave hospital to monitor their heart rhythm remotely. Identifying at risk patients enables early treatment to be undertaken to correct their heart rhythm helping to prevent a further stroke.



SUE AND RODGER SMALLEY RETIRE FROM THE TREASURY TEAM

For the last eight years, Roger and Sue Smalley have been an integral part of the Treasury team, inputting bookkeeping data into the Friends accounting system. Roger took on the role of Assistant Treasurer in 2013 to help the then Treasurer, Rodney Browne, and it wasn't long before Sue began helping him. They have been an enormous support to Peter Skilbeck, who has been the Friends Treasurer since 2016.

Volunteering runs in the family as Roger is the son of Don Smalley, who was the Friends Treasurer from 1983-2003. In that time annual fundraising went from £27,000 to £400,000. Roger would often join the counting team and help his father count the takings after a Friends event such as the fête or flag week.

Roger has enjoyed his time as Assistant Treasurer but says that technology has come a long way in the last eight years and their workload has decreased, as most processes are now seamlessly automated. He is going to continue volunteering for the Friends and you may well bump into him at one of our open gardens.

We would like to thank Roger and Sue for all the help and support that they have given to the Friends over the years and wish them well for the future.


