

Di were presented with Merit Awards, to thank them and mark their outstanding contribution to the charity.

We have been fortunate in the office to be able to read the many tributes to Martin, by family, friends and colleagues. What comes across is what a lovely, kind, generous man he was, quietly helping and supporting many organisations, not just the Friends. Martin never looked for or expected praise and thanks for all that he did, but generously gave his time to make the world a better place for others. Many of the tributes were written by friends and colleagues in the athletics world and from these we learnt that Martin was: a Games Maker at the 2012 Olympics; ran the first London Marathon in 1981 with his brother, Andrew, in under 3 hours and was an announcer at the Special Olympics each year.

Martin will be much missed by all those who knew him. The Executive Committee, Friends Volunteers and Staff count themselves very fortunate to have known and worked with him and send their condolences to his wife and family.

BUILDING FOR OUR FUTURE: HAVE YOUR SAY ABOUT OUR EXCITING NEW DEVELOPMENT PLANS



These are exciting times for healthcare in East Sussex. The Trust has launched the first details of its redevelopment plans for Conquest Hospital, Hastings; Eastbourne DGH and Bexhill under the banner "Building for our Future". Local people are asked to have their say about what they want from the redevelopment of these hospitals.

The government announced earlier in 2020, and more recently confirmed in October, that East Sussex Healthcare NHS Trust would be part of the second phase Health Infrastructure Plan of government funding, which could see over £600m invested. Over £5million has already been committed to develop plans for the three ageing hospitals. A further £6million of funding has been received to start enabling works to help progress these developments.

These extensive plans over the next decade will leave no part of the Trust's hospital infrastructure left untouched. The government announced

a new hospital at Eastbourne; new medical wards and refurbishment at Conquest and a new clinical building at Bexhill. Alongside creating additional inpatient wards and improved parking facilities, these plans include expanding the emergency departments at Eastbourne and Hastings, improving access to cardiology and ophthalmology services, and redeveloping outpatient, theatres, endoscopy and diagnostic services.



This is an once-in-a-lifetime investment that will transform the hospitals at Eastbourne, Hastings and Bexhill and will help to provide better care now and in the future. It is testament to the improvements that have been made over the last five years here in East Sussex and shows confidence that the Government has in East Sussex Healthcare NHS Trust.

Whilst an investment on this scale is substantial, the Trust wants to work with members of staff, partners, patients and local people to prioritise where this money is needed most or where it will make the biggest difference. The 'have your say' project can help develop the Trust's thinking and information gained will be used to develop the plans that will be submitted to the Government in early 2021.

This is the start of what will be a lengthy process and plans will be developed and finessed over time, but this investment is very significant. These are truly exciting times for healthcare in East Sussex as we plan and build for our future. You can have your say at: www.esht.nhs.uk/building-for-our-future/

We shall miss the excitement of receiving a huge variety of paintings to hang at St Andrews Prep, and miss welcoming our visitors to the physical Exhibition. But as the dark evenings draw in we hope you will enjoy browsing through the Friends Virtual Art Exhibition in the comfort and safety of your own home. 




