

The Open Gardens, one fundraising event that has continued through the summer, have this year again raised around £26K for the Friends. The team do so much work to make the gardens such a success. But they need great leaders, Gill Woolley and Heather Harper. Heather has decided after 7 years to take a break from this. I cannot thank her enough on behalf of the Friends for all the work she has done. She has, however, said she will continue supporting the Friends and to host any functions in the future; Possibly another Barn Dance!

The second person I want to thank is June Tickner. June has been one of the Friends volunteers since 1983 but has not been well recently and has decided to cease being one of our money counting team, a role she has fulfilled weekly for the last 36 years. As many of you know June has also made over £43K from the sale of stamps and postcards and she intends to carry on doing that for the foreseeable future. The Friends, once again, cannot thank her enough for all she has done.

The fundraising for this year's major project, raising £500K for the Urology Unit, has almost reached its conclusion. Two big donations were received over the summer that I want to particularly mention. Both captains of the Royal Eastbourne Golf Club made the Friends their charity of the year. We recently received £11K from them towards our Urology Special Project. Secondly, the Willingdon Golf Club chose the Friends to benefit from their charity golf day raising £2K. I thank both these golf clubs for their support and for all their hard work in making so much money for the Friends.

As the Friends new financial year starts we will soon be raising money for a new major project for 2020. This will be announced at this year's AGM which is on 21 November. We hope to see you there.

Lastly, I wish to once again thank all of our fundraisers and volunteers for all that you do for the Friends. Without you we would not exist. Thank you.

Bella and owner Barry Coase, who visit patients at Eastbourne DGH, have won the HiLife Pets as Therapy Dog of the Year award at Crufts 2019. The award was voted for by readers of Yours Magazine and presented by James Middleton, Ambassador for Pets as Therapy.



Since starting her role at Eastbourne DGH, Bella, a four-year old Bichon-Frise, has been a hugely popular part of the team at Eastbourne DGH. On her weekly visits with owner Barry, who works part-time as a parking officer at the hospital, she brings a smile to everyone who meets her.

Barry Coase said: "I'd like to thank everyone who voted and supported us in our journey, it is an absolute pleasure to work with patients and staff at Eastbourne DGH and long may it continue."

Vikki Carruth, ESHT Director of Nursing said: "Bella and Barry have made a real different to patients and staff alike. They've touched so many people's lives by coming onto the ward. It's great to see the positive effect that Bella's visits have on patients. Well done Barry and Bella."

Bella was rescued from the Bichon-Frise rescue service when she was only twenty weeks old. Originally very timid, she has developed into a very sociable dog with the perfect qualities for her Pets as Therapy role.

VOLUNTEERING – WE NEED YOU!

Volunteering for the Friends is a hugely rewarding activity. Our volunteers say that it has brought them new friendships, given them a sense of well-being, a structure to their week and made them feel that they make a difference — which they really do!

We always need new volunteers and at the moment we are particularly looking for people to volunteer in the new Friends of Eastbourne Hospital Radiotherapy Café, which is situated in the foyer of the Radiotherapy/Endoscopy/Day Surgery building. This is a joint venture with Macmillan Cancer Support and the role will get busier as the Radiotherapy Centre broadens the types of cancer it treats and the

number of visitors increases. At the moment we are suggesting to our volunteers that they bring a magazine with them for the quieter times. The café volunteers are not councillors for Macmillan but they do direct people towards the literature that is available, so that anyone who would like to find out more can pick up some information.

You may have seen the advert for a Macmillan Biggest Coffee Morning which is being held from 10 am - 2 pm on Thursday 31 October 2019 at the FoEH Radiotherapy Café. If you would like to visit the café and find out more about what is involved in volunteering there, please do come down. Even if you are not thinking of volunteering for the Friends, do pop in and support the event; there will be a mouth-watering selection of homemade cakes and treats. Donations given for the cakes will be for Macmillan whilst hot and cold drinks will be charged as normal. Remember, parking is free for the first 30 minutes.



We are also looking for more shop volunteers, particularly for the weekends. Do you think you could spare some time? The shop is open from 10 am to 4 pm on 5 atturdays and from 1.30 pm to 4 pm on 5 sundays. There are two shifts on Saturdays from 10 am - 1 pm and 1 pm to 4 pm and 5 one shift on 5 sundays. There are 3 shifts each weekday: morning, early afternoon

and late afternoon until 6.30 pm. Volunteers rotate between roles and go from serving customers on the till to restocking and tidying the shop. Training is given and no previous experience is necessary.

When someone gets in touch to enquire about volunteering for the Friends we ask them what days they are available to work and invite them in for a taster session. If they enjoy the session we give them an application pack to complete and send to Zoe in the Voluntary Services Office. We then find them a shift to suit their availability. Volunteering is a regular commitment and the shops and trolley services have shift times that need to be covered which are usually 3 or 4 hours long.

Our motto is "help us, help them, help you"; you really can make a difference by volunteering for the Friends at the Eastbourne DGH.



TRUST NEWS



The Trust would like to say a big thank you to the Friends of Eastbourne Hospital for two new clinical tympanometers. These are used by our Audiology department to perform detailed assessments of the middle ear, eustachian tube and acoustic reflex pathway on patients of all ages, including new born babies. They will be

used in Paediatric Audiology clinics held at Eastbourne Park Practice and in the Audiology and Ear, Nose & Throat clinics at the Eastbourne DGH.

The care of cancer patients at East Sussex Healthcare NHS Trust has again been highly praised in a national survey of patients who were diagnosed with the disease. The National Cancer Patient Experience Survey, now in its eighth year, has been published and was completed by over 500 local patients. Patients were asked to rate their care overall on a scale of 1-10 and patients in East Sussex rated their care as 8.8 out of 10.

Cancer care for Haematology and Lung patients scored particularly well with scores above the national averages. Out of the 59 areas looked at by the survey the Trust scored above the national average in five areas. Patients praised the care that they received from our Clinical Nurse Specialists with ease of access and having all their contact details being highlighted. Patients were particularly complimentary about the levels of information that they were given and the timeliness of it.

The report illustrates the excellent work being done by our multidisciplinary teams and our chemotherapy units to care for cancer patients in East Sussex. We will be reflecting on the areas where further improvements can be made. Particularly in talking to our patients about how they can engage with research projects and clinical trials.

We are delighted our Consultant Cardiologist Professor Nikhil Patel has been elected Chairman of the Royal Society of Medicine (RSM) Academic Board. As Chairman of the RSM Academic Board, Professor Patel is a Trustee of the Society and oversees the network of 50 medical specialty sections. He will be supporting new educational strategies and developing programmes with the presidents of the society's specialty sections.
