#### FUNDRAISING

Firstly, we must advise you that we were disappointed to hear that Virgin Money Giving will be closing at the end of November this year. We are currently researching a replacement online donation partner and will give more details in the next magazine. We want to make sure that we get the best value for our donors, along with good back-up service and a simple user-friendly way of giving. We will be making contact with all those that make regular payments this way as soon as we have chosen a new partner.

Once again, we have been overwhelmed by the many and varied ways people fundraise on our behalf. One lady kindly donated the auction sale proceeds of her late mother's personal effects, with help from Eastbourne Auctions.



The Eastbourne branch of the Soroptomists chose the Friends as their Charity of the year, and despite not being able to hold as many fundraising events as they would have liked, presented us with a cheque for  $\pm 1,097.65$ .

The inaugural Conquest v DGH football match was held in early September. Although the DGH lost by 7 goals to 4, the Friends won as they raised  $\pounds 270$  from the sale of drinks and snacks, match fees and donations. We would like to thank Paul Gosling, a nurse here at the DGH, who organised this and Sue Hitchen from the Friends shop for sorting out the refreshments. This will now become an annual event with the venue alternating between Eastbourne and Hastings each year.

We are grateful to Julie Rowe and her team at the Aqua Bar, Pevensey Bay who donated  $\pounds 264$  from an all-day music festival, Pev Fest, held in August.

#### SHOP REPORT

The shops and trolleys are a lifeline for the hospital's visitors, patients and staff providing a very varied range of things to buy, from sandwiches to knitted toys and everything in between. In fact, nearly everything that you need when you're in hospital is sold in the shop, so do pop in and have a look. To make it even easier there is 30 minutes free parking in the visitor car park.
