CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Can I wish you all a very happy New Year and hope none of you caught any of the horrible bugs that have been around?



The year ended once again on a high with both the Art Exhibition and Christmas Coffee Morning making record amounts this year for the Friends. Also, we held an excellent Dine around the World, this time at the Thai Marina; an outstanding venue with wonderful food which helped the Friends raise $\pounds750$.

One person I wish to mention and thank is Kristine Powley, the widow of John Powley, who held an art sale of John's paintings at the new Welcome Centre in Eastbourne in December. A huge number of the paintings were sold and, although I haven't heard the final amount yet, I believe Kristine raised about £5,000 for the Friends. I would like to say a huge thank you to Kristine on behalf of the Friends.

The Friends' AGM was held in November where I was able to announce that the Friends had achieved its target of raising $\pounds 500,000$ for the Urology Investigation Suite. The Suite is now fully up and running, seeing an enormous number of patients each week. Steve Garnett, a consultant Urologist, gave a short presentation on how the Friends' contribution had made their department a state of the art unit for Urology.

So what about this coming year's major project? The Friends want to raise £500,000 to replace 50 patient monitors with more modern and greatly upgraded ones. These will, with the agreed upgrade of the Eastbourne DGH Wi-Fi Network that the Trust are paying for, allow medical and other clinical staff to centrally observe seriously ill patients being monitored in the Emergency Department, Critical Care, Coronary Care, Medical Assessment Unit, Theatre Recovery and the Stroke Unit and store all their vital signs and results. This will enable even quicker interventions in patient care and potentially help save lives.

I am sure you and the population of Eastbourne will support the Friends and help us raise the money for this much needed monitoring equipment as you have done for many, many years. Thank you in anticipation.

TRUST NEWS

As we start a New Year the Trust would like to thank the Friends of Eastbourne Hospital for all their amazing support last year and your continued support this year.

The Trust showed improvement across a number of important areas in the CQC's Children and Young People's Patient Experience Survey 2018. The survey showed the Trust is better than most Trusts in five areas and showed significant improvement in twelve areas from the corresponding survey undertaken in 2016. The survey results recognise that the hard work of our team is valued by our parents and carers and their children. We will use this feedback to develop and enhance the service further as we work towards becoming a provider of outstanding care.

The Department for Health and Social Care has confirmed that it will be investing ± 13.86 m as a capital loan into the Trust over the next three years, with £4.6m being invested this financial year alone (before 31st March 2020). This investment is additional to our capital funding for the year. It is welcome news and will go towards upgrading our 40 year old hospital at Eastbourne. with the money primarily spent internal fire on compartmentalisation works such as replacing and updating fire doors, floors and walls. While this upgrade is happening, wards may need to move to allow the vital work to take place. This will provide us with an opportunity to also improve the quality of our ward accommodation.

Visitors to the hospital may have heard a voice alert smoking message at the main entrance. It is part of a pilot to deter smokers and remind them they are only permitted to smoke in the designated smoking shelters. The pre-recorded messages can be activated by patients, visitors or staff by pressing a button. As a healthcare provider it is unacceptable for patients and visitors, including new born babies and those arriving via ambulance, to have to pass through cigarette smoke at our hospital entrances; so too is it unacceptable for our staff to have to suffer smoke wafting back into the hospital through open windows.

As part of an upgrade to our telephone system, we have introduced a new main 0300 telephone number. The new number is 0300 131 4500 which goes through to a central switchboard with calls charged at a caller's usual network rate. The existing DGH numbers will be operational for a while but will be phased out at some point.
