CHAIRMAN'S NOTES

This is my second report since taking over as Chair in January at the Friends' AGM. I am still learning the role and making contacts within the town that I hope will help to further the ambitions of the Friends. I would like to thank the trustees and office staff who have supported me in these early months.

It has been a busy three months since my last report. During this time the new Chief Executive of the Trust, Adrian Bull, has started and has very rapidly set about meeting staff and others to start the rebuilding of morale within the Trust. On 12 May the annual Trust Awards ceremony was held at the De La Warr Pavilion in Bexhill. I was there to present the award for "Developing Excellent Services and Improving Quality of Care" to the Eastbourne Critical Care Unit, an award sponsored by the Friends. It was an excellent evening seemingly enjoyed by all the staff present.

As you know the Friends major project for this year is to buy a new CT scanner for the hospital. Alongside this the Friends have also purchased other essential equipment for the hospital with both the ophthalmology and Critical Care departments benefitting, amongst others.

Fundraising has continued with several events in the last three months. On 8 May the annual tennis tournament took place with a record number of entrants. An excellent tea was provided, and a raffle helped to make it a very successful tennis fundraiser; many thanks to Bo Phillips for organising this event. Also in May, Sue Hitchen, the manager of the Friends shops in the hospital, organised a Quiz at the Fishermen's club.



There was a full house and £500 was raised. My team came about mid table. Beats my usual quiz position of last or there abouts! Pictured left is the team from Seaside Medical Centre and a picture of "Blind Elk" (Jo and Eric Knight, Rupert Shaw and Rob Wicks), who won the quiz, is on the back page of this

magazine. Sue is organising another quiz on 25 November so keep your eyes open for an advert and book your team in.

The Open Gardens season kicked off on 18 May and even despite really bad weather this first one was well attended. Again it appears to be a record year for attendance so far with other gardens still to be open. On 20 May Rosemary Cameron held her annual coffee morning at her home which raised $\pm 1,400$.

The annual cream tea took place on 19 June at East Dean village Hall with many stalls to purchase things from as well as a cream tea. I was very worried that being Father's Day the turn out would be poor but my fears proved unfounded and the Friends took just over £3,000 on the day, more than last year. So well done and many thanks for those who came along and particularly those volunteers who worked so hard to make it such a success.

What about the future weeks? By the time you read this a new event, "Magic on the Pier", a magic show with barbecue, will have happened. I'm sure it will be a great success especially if the weather is good. The Art Exhibition planning is going well for the end of October and I will tell you more about that in the next issue of Hospitality. Another new event, a wine tasting of Ridgeview Vineyard sparkling wines, is planned for the 7 October. Put this date in your diary. Some other exciting new projects are being planned for 2017 and when these are firmed up I will let you know more.

As well as raising funds the Friends also organise three lectures a year which are open to the public. The first of these took place on 19 May. As



usual there was a full house as the subject was very topical - "CT - the Future Today". This informative and entertainina talk was aiven by Dr Neil Barlow, Consultant Radiologist, pictured left with Peter Nash. The next two lectures are on 28 July and 15 September. The topics are

"Dementia - a Snippet" and "Recent Advances in the Management of Diabetic Eye Disease". If you wish to attend either of these then please ring the Friends office and book your place.

None of these events would happen without the hard work of the trustees and volunteers. The Friends of the Hospital are always looking for volunteers, either to help out in the shops or at the fundraising events. SHOP REPORT

If you have never visited our shops before, do make a point of going in next time you are in the hospital. The shop in the main foyer is a real treasure trove and there is very little you can't get there, from your daily paper to a pot of honey and all things in between.

We have recently taken delivery of the new Ulster Weaver range of bags, well worth looking at, especially as we now have to remember to take a bag with us whenever we go shopping. To pop in your new bag, why not treat yourself to a couple of paperback books which are on sale for only $\pounds 2.99$ each.

If you have a sweet tooth but can't find your favourite type of sweet on the shelves, please let the volunteers know and they will try very hard to make sure they are there for your next visit.

We have a wide range of nightwear and underwear to fit all sizes (up to 30 and 2XL), and hospital recommended slippers for men and women. With half an hour free parking you can upgrade your night attire without the hassle of going into town.

Following our request in the last magazine for more 'special people' to help with the daily sandwich trolley round, we had some successful applicants but would like some more people to join the team. Please don't be put off by the early start if you are worried about not being able to use your ESCC bus pass at that time. The Hospital Trust will reimburse you for any travel expenses incurred while volunteering in this way. You must be able to offer a regular commitment and be able to get to the shop by 8.45 am, but you will find this so rewarding as the trolley gets such a warm welcome in the wards. The round takes about three hours each morning. If this is something you have been thinking about but are not quite sure, pick up the phone and ring the office (01323 438236) and we can arrange a trial session for you.

If you are more of an 'afternoon person' you might prefer to work on the sweet trolley round or in the shop itself. No two days are the same and we need several people at any one time, so do give this some consideration too. The FRIENDS OF THE EASTBOURNE HOSPITAL was established in 1948 shortly before the introduction of the National Health Service when it became apparent that the resources would not be enough to meet the cost of all the necessities and amenities for Staff and Patients.

Originally called 'The Patients Association' it was renamed 'The Friends of the Eastbourne Hospitals' (FoEH) in 1953 and became affiliated to the National Association of Leagues of Hospital Friends, now renamed ATTEND. The charity is now known as the Friends of the Eastbourne Hospital.

The aims and objectives of the FoEH can be summarised:

- 1. To provide funds for extra services, equipment and amenities for patients and staff and to make donations where the expenditure has been recommended by the relevant NHS Trust and has been approved by the Committee.
- 2. To encourage voluntary work in the hospital.
- 3. To provide a link between the hospital and the community.

Membership is open to anyone paying a Membership Fee. This is $\pounds 25$ for Life Membership and $\pounds 5$ for Annual Membership, which is due on 1st September each year.

The subscription also covers a free copy of this quarterly magazine, HOSPITALITY, which is delivered by volunteers, although all members with addresses outside our hand delivery areas are encouraged to supply postage stamps for their copies.
