#### CHAIRMAN'S REPORT



I can't believe it is three months since my last report. But so much has been happening in the world since then. Covid restrictions have been lifted but the disease is still out there so I am sure, like me, you are still taking precautions, such as mask wearing, when in enclosed spaces. And of course the dreadful atrocities occurring

in Ukraine and its threat to world peace. Fingers crossed a solution can be found very soon.

As you know the major project this year is to raise £500K towards a replacement robot for Urology. People have said to me that we only bought one 7 or so years ago so why do we need another? After years of continuous use and successful treatment of hundreds of patients, the old machine has finally broken down beyond repair. It is very important that this machine is replaced for several reasons. Firstly Eastbourne is a regional centre for Urology cancer and an updated robot ensures the DGH remains at the forefront of Urology Surgery. Secondly, the robot provides excellent opportunities for training so attracts future robotic surgeons to Eastbourne. And thirdly patients experience gold standard care with faster recovery times and reduced lengths of hospital stay. So I am sure you will agree with me that it is important that we support fundraising for this project.

As well as the robot the Friends have been able to purchase an additional machine for PCR testing for Microbiology. This will speed up the turnaround of results and can also be used for other testing too. Currently other big bids have had to be put on hold due to lack of funds but hopefully we will be able to consider them in the future.

Special thanks need to go to all those who have kindly donated money to the Friends in the last 3 months, and a special thank you also to Langney Sports Club that made us their charity for their February quiz which raised £631.

As I mentioned in my last report the Friends have restarted the fundraising events. Upcoming ones include Dine Around the World at Dem Shish on 11 May, a Barn Dance on 11 June, and the Open Gardens which start on 18 May. I hope to see you at some of these. Once again, I really appreciate your continued support to the Friends.

#### **NEWS FROM THE TRUST**

### CONSULTANT ORTHOPAEDIC SURGEON APPOINTED PRESIDENT-ELECT OF THE MEDICAL WOMEN'S FEDERATION.

One of our consultant orthopaedic surgeons has been appointed president-elect of the Medical Women's Federation. Mrs Scarlett McNally, who has worked at East Sussex Healthcare NHS Trust (ESHT) since 2002 and has been a key role model in the Women in Surgery initiative over the past three decades, was elected to the role in February.

The Medical Women's Federation (MWF) is the voice of UK medical women on medical issues and aims to improve the working lives of women doctors, amplify their voices and provide a unique network of women doctors in all stages of their career.

Scarlett said: "I am delighted to have been elected! I want to see women doctors and medical students supported to thrive in the NHS. I also hope that we can influence across other sectors, so the whole population is supported to keep healthy."

Alongside her clinical role at ESHT, Scarlett is deputy director at the Centre for Perioperative Care, where she works across royal colleges to get people as fit as possible for their surgery. She also works to make processes better and cross-skill workforces to empower patients and staff.

She said: "I have recently returned to work part-time after ill-health. I feel that my experience of being a patient has helped with being a surgeon, giving me a different view on health and how the NHS should work. For example, I built up my fitness with electric cycling, so that I could be eligible for a stem cell transplant for myeloma with cardiac



amyloidosis. I now fit chemotherapy around work. I also had a hip replacement last year and now understand just how amazing orthopaedic surgery really is!"

Scarlett was the ninth woman elected to the Council of the Royal College of Surgeons of England, serving on the council between 2011 and 2021, and is a key voice in raising awareness of the importance of avoiding unconscious bias and taking the pressure off doctors.

She said: "There is lots of evidence now that the experiences of women as doctors, medical students and citizens are different from those of men. There are many ways that we can make things more equal, as individuals and as institutions. I am passionate about getting everyone to be the best that they can be. Change is possible. This means improving respect, support, opportunities, culture and education for staff and students."

#### **VOLUNTEER TERESA IS 90 YEARS YOUNG**

Volunteer Teresa Crofts turned 90 recently after volunteering Eastbourne DGH for almost 16 years. Teresa volunteers in the main reception area two days a week in a meet and areet role. assistina visitors with checking in for appointments or to find their way around the hospital. Teresa has helped to develop her volunteer role. which changed from information desk position to a meet and greet one during the pandemic.

Teresa always shows respect and compassion to visitors and patients who need help when they come into hospital or seek support through the bereavement service. Teresa enjoys volunteering and has been a great role model for new volunteers who join our service.

Teresa was presented with flowers and a gift by Lorraine Mason, Assistant Director of HR, to mark her 90th.



#### CELEBRATING NATIONAL CANCER CNS DAY

In March 2022 the Trust celebrated cancer clinical nurse specialists (CNS) on the first National Cancer CNS Day.

The day highlights the role clinical nurse specialists play in supporting people with cancer. Cancer clinical nurse specialists are experts in different types of cancer and help patients to understand their diagnosis and support them through their cancer experience.

Katy Hollobon, Macmillan Breast Clinical Nurse Specialist, joined our Trust in 2011, first on Pevensey Day Unit and then later as a breast CNS. She says:

"I became a Macmillan Breast CNS because I wanted to make a difference to patients' lives by supporting them through their diagnosis and subsequent treatments. To be able to help, at possibly the toughest time of someone's life, makes me feel very privileged and I love doing what I do!"

# JUBILEE YEAR CELEBRATING ALONGSIDE THE QUEEN

Whether you're unfurling the bunting, planning to plant a tree, or simply intending to enjoy the additional bank holiday gifted to the nation on this jubilee year, this summer we celebrate a historic 70 years of Queen Elizabeth II's reign.

In the same year the Queen acceded to the throne. Eastbourne's formerlynamed Patients Association (established in 1948) was renamed The Friends of the Eastbourne Hospitals, and so our own history of serving our community as the 'Friends' began. Our purpose at the outset was to provide support to eight of Eastbourne's hospitals - Princess Alice, St Mary's, The Leaf, Merlynn Convalescent, Gildredge, Downside, Eye Hospital and the ENT Hospital. Closures and consolidations over the decades have seen seven of the original eight hospitals close their doors, meaning that the Eastbourne DGH now stands as the only hospital receiving Friends' support. It is the location of the Friends' office. and the base for a team of over 100 inhouse volunteers.



From the proud notation in 1956 that a total of £1000 had been raised to gift to the hospitals across the year, to our biggest ever project in 2015 which raised £1 million for a Da Vinci surgical robot, it is recorded that over £18 million in total has been raised over our 70+ years.

So, in a happy coincidence, as we celebrate the Queen's 70 years of service, we also mark 70 years of bearing the name of the Friends, reflecting on the work we have done, the achievements we've had, and how we have grown since 1952.


