

#### **CHAIRMAN'S REPORT**



In my first report since the death of Queen Elizabeth II, I would like to acknowledge our gratitude to her for the service she gave, for her recognition of the dedication, courage, compassion and skill of the NHS, and for the example she was to us all. Along with the rest of the nation, our condolences are with her family.

Even though Covid still hovers in the background it has been great to get our events back to a sense of normality. Attendance at our Open Gardens has been very good and the season raised over £18,000. As the summer holidays end, our autumn programme of events is ready to go - the Art Exhibition, Autumn Fair, Quiz, and another Dine around the World are already booked in.

The fundraising for the major project will be completed by the time of the AGM on 23rd November. My personal thanks to all of our members and the Eastbourne community for your support in raising £500K for this wonderful project. The Trust will soon let us know their ideas for next year's projects, and I hope to be able to announce which one we will supporting at the AGM.

It is with sadness that I announce that Sue Hitchen has retired as manager of our shops. Sue has worked tirelessly for many years for the Friends and has hugely increased the profits over that time. I wish Sue a very happy retirement from all of the trustees of the Friends.

Another retiree is Peter Nash who will step down as President at the AGM. Peter has been President for 7 years and was Chair for 10 years prior to that. Under Peter's leadership and guidance the Friends has grown as an organisation and I am personally grateful for all the support he has given me during my time as Chair.

We have not had many departmental bids for equipment for a while. However we have agreed to support the refurbishment of the staff restaurant to make it a more usable and pleasant environment for staff. We have used the £10K that remained in our Covid fund to support this.

Once again my thanks to all our members for your continued support of the Friends and I hope to see some of you at this autumn's events, including our AGM.

## FRIENDS PURCHASE IOPI DEVICES FOR STROKE REHABILITATION

We received thanks from the Speech and Language Therapists in the Community Stroke Rehabilitation Team for the purchase of two IOPI (Iowa Oral Performance Instrument) devices. These devices will be used in patient therapy to measure tongue strength and endurance, and lip strength and endurance.

This aids these therapists by documenting deficits that iustify treatment. differentiatina between muscle weakness and problems of motor control. and providing biofeedback during isometric oral motor exercise programs. also motivate patients by showina them their progress from therapy.

#### PETER NASH BIDS FAREWELL TO FOEH



It is with very mixed feelings that I have decided to stand down as President and a Trustee of the Friends at our AGM in November. However, after 45 years of continuous association with the DGH, the time is right.

I first came to Eastbourne in 1967, having graduated from Sheffield University Medical School, on attachment from the Royal Air Force, as a House Surgeon and subsequently House Physician at the old St Mary's, and Princess Alice Hospitals, before returning and completing my service with the RAF, where I trained as an anaesthetist.

In March 1977, on retiring from the RAF, I returned to Eastbourne as a Consultant Anaesthetist at the DGH shortly before its official opening by HRH Princess Alexandra. The next 20 years were both challenging and, at times frustrating. It saw the development of services which were in their infancy — the development

of intensive care services from the occasional need into a fully functioning and very busy Intensive Care Unit, and the introduction of pain services both in the form of a Pain Clinic and the widening of a pain relief service in Maternity, being examples from my own specialty. At the same time there was a big expansion in both numbers and the training experience of Consultants across all specialties, bringing with them newer ideas and procedures. Minimally invasive introduced. surgery was Medical Specialties also had a similar expansion and newer procedures e.g. cardiac catheterisation. All of this required fundina and additional expensive equipment - in many cases assisted by the Friends. Behind the scenes the requirement for support and other diagnostic services increased, as a result Pathology and Radiology services had to be expanded, the latter also taking on more interventional procedures - also requiring expensive equipment, again supported by the Friends.

Management was not exempt, with numerous initiatives, principal of these was the creation of Hospital Trusts — on looking back the DGH thrived during this period. In the late 1990's plans were introduced to merge Trusts and combine their resources. This amalgamation of Trusts ultimately led to the rationalisation of services between sites e.g. The DGH and Conquest Hospital. Much has, of course, been written and said about this in the past and, no doubt, in the future.

Many requests for new equipment were being made directly to the Friends, and in 2003 I was invited to join the trustees with the remit of liaising with the management over these requests to ensure they were both necessary and

not duplicating equipment already within the hospital. I was both pleased and honoured by this request, and at the same time began to learn and be amazed at just how much the Friends were doing in supporting the hospital, not just in equipment purchasing, but also the support of the staff, the patients and their visitors much of which went, and still goes, unnoticed. In 2005, I was appointed Chairman and, on stepping down, after 10 years invited to become your President.

There have been many highlights during my time as a Trustee - far too many to record here. We have supported every department in the hospital, but two achievements stand out for me - the expansion and refurbishment of Pevensey Ward, and the purchase of the robot for Urology (the latter alone costing £1million and making the department one of the leading centres in the country). There have been many others, ITU, Radiology, Post-operative Recovery Ward, A&E are but a few, whilst provision of comforts for relatives has not been neglected including a refurbishment of the Hospital Chapel as an area for prayer and silent reflection including a multi-faith room. We have also introduced talks for the public on medical matters in lay terms which, unfortunately, had to be suspended during the pandemic although it is hoped to be able to reintroduce them next year. In addition a

generous legacy has enabled us to set up a fund for the benefit of staff, including bursaries to extend their knowledge and skills and, through these, the benefit of patients.

The Friends were first formed in April 1948 (a few months before the NHS) and, ever since, the Friends have been there to support the local Hospital services and will do so for as long as they are needed. I believe that need is now greater than ever. In 2018, we celebrated our 70th anniversary with the occasion being marked by the unveiling of a plaque by HRH Princess Alexandra 41 years after she formally opened the DGH - I was present at both events!

Looking back, I thoroughly enjoyed my career both clinically and latterly through the Friends. I feel proud to have played a part in the expansion and development of the DGH and extremely honoured to have been both your Chairman and President. The Friends are a great organisation and make a very significant contribution to the Hospital, none of which is achievable without the support of our members and the generosity of the local population you have been magnificent and I can step back with the knowledge that with your continued support, the Friends continue to go from strength to strength.

If you have ever visited the shop the chances are that you will have either been served by Sue or seen her rushing around in the background. Like many of us Sue started as a volunteer, initially on the trolley service. But it soon became apparent that she was destined for

greater things, and before long she took over the rotas and was running the trolley teams.

When the previous shop manager left Sue applied for the job and was successful with her application, and has been running the shop ever since. In this time the job has grown to include managing the Flower Shop (which is currently closed). expanding the trolley service to include a seven dav a week morning round for the staff with sandwiches

drinks and snacks for those that cannot get to the staff restaurant and more recently the Friends Radiotherapy Café.

Sue has always gone the extra mile, will cover for any absent volunteer and over the years has put in thousands of extra hours to deal with any unexpected situation that has cropped up. She has ensured that the shop is always fully stocked with what the customers want, and this was tested to the limit during the early stages of Covid-19 when supplies were so hard to come by.

During all that time Sue made sure that the shop remained open for part of each day so that the hard working staff could get a sandwich or little treat to keep them going.

As if that isn't more than enough to keep one person busy, Sue was always there at the fairs and coffee mornings, either selling stock from the shop, looking after the cake stalls or acting as Front of House at the Cream Tea to welcome visitors.

She would also be the servina the person drinks after the **Education** Lectures. and one of the greatest personal supporters of any event that was organised by the Friends. encouraging many of the volunteers to come along. Another valuable 'side-line' that for the past few Sue has vears organised a series of popular auizzes for the Friends, with a regular throughout following the town. We very much hope these will continue.



It would be impossible to say how much Sue has contributed financially to the Friends over the years, and everyone truly thanks her for all that she has done. Sue will be a very hard act to follow but as we move on we must look for a new manager, who will have big boots to fill.


