

NAME ANNOUNCED FOR MAJOR NEW FACILITY AT EDGH

The name of the new elective surgical facility at Eastbourne District General Hospital has now been formally announced as the 'Sussex Surgical Centre'.

The name had been chosen after a competition among trust staff who had the opportunity to put forward their choices for a name for the new facility. The Sussex Surgical Centre name is a combination of two winning entries, reflecting the role of the new centre and how it will support not just care in the Eastbourne and East Sussex areas but across the whole of Sussex.

Open from 7am to 11pm and conducting procedures from 8am to 6pm, initially five days a week before moving to six days in the future, the will deliver a project modern. purpose-built day surgery unit which will include a preassessment area, four theatres, admission, recovery and discharge space as well as support facilities. It will offer Sussex residents the opportunity to have day surgery procedure their performed more quickly and in a purpose-built environment that allows extra capacity to address both current and future surgical needs. The project has been built thanks to £22.5m from the government's elective recovery funding.

Caroline Ansell, MP for Eastbourne and Willingdon, who announced the name of the centre, said:

"I'm delighted to announce that this fantastic facility will be called the Sussex Surgical Centre. The people of Eastbourne and across Sussex



deserve the very best care that the NHS can provide; the centre will deliver that excellent care, and represents a major investment by the government into our local NHS. It was very exciting to join Joe along with the estates and clinical staff at the trust to see the progress on the site and talk through the plans for how it will work in practice to deliver the care that our communities need."

Joe Chadwick-Bell, Chief Executive of East Sussex Healthcare NHS Trust, said:

"The Sussex Surgical Centre is part of ongoing investment into our Eastbourne District General Hospital as the hub of day case surgery for the people of Eastbourne and more widely across Sussex. As well as the bricks and mortar development, we are working on new ways of delivering surgical care in the centre enabling us to see more people, more quickly. Thank you to everyone involved in the project for all of their continued hard work in improving our services in East Sussex and beyond."

Work on the elective surgical hub is planned to be completed in Spring 2025.

SPORTS NEWS!

As proud sponsors of the DGH's football team, we're always pleased to hear how the boys have been getting on. Captain Paul Gosling has been busy organising a few friendlies within the community recently, beating Lewes Prison 8-4, but narrowly losing to Hampden Park FC 3-4. Read on for Paul's match report of the team's most recent game.

On Saturday 30th March, EDGH FC faced off against SECAM in a friendly game of football.

The DGH, sporting their yellow and blue Friends of Eastbourne Hospital kit were full of confidence after only narrowly being beaten by established league team Hampden Park in a previous game, and this confidence showed as they quickly gained control of the game and started to press their ambulance colleagues.

The dominance of the DGH was felt at either end of the pitch, with some excellent defensive interceptions, resolute tackling and a disciplined line at the back, and some exceptional chances being created up front. Friends of the DGH volunteer Lew took full advantage of those chances, as Connor teed him up, allowing Lew to bang in a screamer from the edge of the box. 1-0 DGH. The ambulance team, wearing all black, did get their chances, but it was a defensive error on their part which allowed Mike to slip the ball in to Lew for his, and the DGH's second goal. 2-0. The DGH continued to press, and a resulting corner was crossed in with precision by Adam and met by one of our shortest players with a glancing header to make it 3-0 to the DGH, and give Lew his hat trick.

The second half saw a very different ambulance team on the pitch, and it showed as they hounded the DGH box.

Despite this pressure, the DGH crafted an exceptional counter attack down the left flank, and with a quick ball in from Paul, Mike took his opportunity to hit the back of the net, and the DGH increased their lead to 4.

The final whistle came, and the DGH recorded their first ever clean sheet with their impressive 4-0 win. All monies raised, including the ref who donated his match fee, were donated to the Friends of Eastbourne Hospital.


